
As restrictions begin to ease, we move forward with excitement and caution. We've noticed increased traffic to our branch

Be Aware of Scams
Involving P2P Payments

Scams among Peer-to-Peer (P2P) mobile payment services are on the rise.

Here are some tips for using these services such as Venmo, Zelle, Paypal and more to send money instantly.





Customer Service Scams

If you receive an unexpected inquiry from a business or government agency, verify the authenticity with information on the company or government agency's website.

P2P Apps will never ask you for your pin or sensitive information via a phone call.

Charity Scams

Scammers will often ask for fake charitable donations, posing as a charity in need.

Be wary about sending donations through a P2P App, and throughly check the background of any charity to make sure you donation goes to the real organization.


Understand how and if you can recover funds should a problem arise when using a P2P service.
